The Coyote, most commonly associated with the desert country of the Southwestern United States, is rapidly becoming a frequent sight all across the continent. The coyote is well known for his adaptability, predicated by survival instincts. Coyotes are considered to be the smartest animal alive and most difficult to come in close contact with.

Possessing keen eyesight and hearing, the coyote can spot the slightest movement up to a mile away. It can also pinpoint the location of a sound from a similar distance, to within three meters.

Capturing the wary predator on film is a most difficult, yet gratifying challenge when the coyote, an excellent natural hunter, can be coaxed into hunting the hunter holding a camera.

About the image

The image of the coyote used for this stamp was captured on film by photographer W. C. "Bill" Porter, early on the morning of January 1, 1999 at a location not far from the Very Large Array (VLA) site, near Magdalena, New Mexico. Once a suitable spot was selected to set up the cameras, the photographer used a hand-blown predator call to attract the coyote to the stand. Within mere seconds of making the first call, sounding like a distressed rabbit, the coyote came running in at full speed for what it thought would be an easy meal.
